PORTLAND—The 10th annual *Maine Walks with Haiti 5K* walk/run will be held at 8:30 a.m. Saturday, June 8, at Back Cove Park in Portland (across from Hannaford). The event is an annual fundraiser for Konbit Sante Cap-Haitien Health Partnership, a 501(c)(3) founded in Maine in 2001 to strengthen capacity for healthcare in the Portland sister city of Cap-Haitien, Haiti.
